- 1. Moving up one grade in reading level, say from 9th grade to 10th grade reading level, requires an hour of reading a day. For students who are below grade in reading level, they actually need to read more than this to catch up and be college ready by the time they graduate.
- 2. Reading long, complex texts is more important now than ever. The new Common Core Standards in both English and Math require students to read longer texts with more challenging vocabulary. Just as important: The new SAT, which is being unveiled for the first time this year, will require much
